





Common Struggles When Abroad

Loss and Separation

First real separation from family and friends---The difference between miles from campus and continents

away.

Travel Stress

Challenge of navigating the unfamiliar and the enhanced security that is part of travel. <u>Time and Climate Change</u> Sleep and eating pattern disturbances. <u>Culture Shock</u> Differences in housing, food and atmosphere can tax mental functioning.

Safety While Abroad



Always adhere to local laws, culture and conduct of your host institution and Endicott College

Safety Abroad

- State Department Worldwide Caution
 - Standard protocol. Be alert and aware of surroundings.
- Follow host institution protocols
 - Fill out travel forms/provide notification
- Communication protocol: partner, Endicott, parents
- Use buddy system
- Tell a friend staying behind what your travel plans are
- Register with U.S. Embassy
 - Smart Traveller Enrollment Program (STEP) step.state.gov/step/
- U.S. State Department Students Abroad Portal <u>travel.state.gov</u>





Health Insurance

- You are insured by GeoBlue Insurance while abroad
- Access your account at: <u>members.geobluestudents.com</u>
- Email with insurance information. **Please activate your account.**
- Covers hospitalization, medical evacuation, repatriation
- What do you do if you are ill & need medical attention?
 - Notify your RA/Student Life Office
 - Call the number on the back of your card
 - Provide your name/location
 - Seek medical care at the designated hospital
- Students must be prepared to pay up front at time of appointment in case of lag time on guarantee of payment. Should this happen, please obtain an itemized bill and contact GeoBlue to submit your claim for reimbursement.

Medications

- □ Inform your physician of your upcoming travel
- Bring 3 month supply of medications, if allowed by insurance company/doctor
- Know generic medication name
- Bring medications in original containers
- Know if your medication is allowed in your host country. Example: Adderall is illegal in Italy, therefore students must seek an alternate medication from their doctor
 - GeoBlue can assist you with medication searches
- You cannot ship medications in the mail. Plan ahead to refill prescriptions while abroad.

Conduct While Abroad

- Endicott College Conduct Agreement Signature Document
- As a student, you are under Endicott's, your host institution's and host country's rules/laws
- Host institution reserves the right to expel you
- Conduct issues are reported to the Office of International Education

PRACTICAL & LOGISTICAL INFORMATION

Passports & Visas

- Passport must be valid 6 months <u>AFTER</u> program end date
- Keep photocopy in a safe place while abroad
- Upload passport to Endicott application portal, send scanned copy to your email.



Important Forms

Medical Form – Upload Online

- Doctor's Contact Information
- Current ailments & medications
- Immunizations. Refer to CDC website for country specific questions.
- Information kept confidential
- Provided to university partners when necessary
- Flight Itinerary- Upload Online
 - Students traveling on a group flight will upload the provided itinerary

Housing

- Take time to adapt to your new housing! Housing abroad <u>will</u> be different
- Address concerns locally, <u>first</u>

Don't take the STUDY out of Study Abroad

Academic Differences: US and Abroad

Endicott College	International Universities
Small-medium class sizes	Possible large lecture or tutorial-style classes
Continuous assessment Many papers & quizzes	1 or 2 points of assessment (Mid-term and/or Final)
Discussion-based: professors ask for students' opinions	Professor may only lecture: not ask for students' opinions

Academic Credit Transfer

- All courses are pre-approved by your Academic Dean
- All course changes made while abroad must be updated
 - Endicott Course Approval Form in application (while abroad phase)
 - Enrolling in courses not pre-approved will result in a delay in transcript processing
- Official transcript sent to Office of International Education
- Courses abroad converted to US grade equivalent
- Grades factor into GPA. Grades are <u>not</u> pass/fail!
- Process time: up to 4 months. Transcript arrival times are at the discretion/time frame of the host institution.




Course Registration & Housing Selection

Registration


- Contact Academic Advisor

- Register course selections online at designated time (U.S. time zone)

Things to Remember When Packing:

Airline baggage limits: Check fees and weight limits

- Travel documents (in your CARRY-ON bag)
 - passport & visa
 - financial documents
 - airline tickets (including the return portion)
 - acceptance letter from your overseas program
 - address of the university or housing location
- Some luggage essentials (in your CARRY-ON bag)
 - prescription medication in case of delayed luggage
 - glasses/contacts & solution
 - travel sized toiletries and change of clothes



Packing Tips

- Pack lightly. When in doubt, don't pack it!
- Pack what you can carry up a flight of stairs.
 Save space for your return.
- Research seasonal temperatures
- Purchase hair dryers, straighteners etc. abroad
- Don't forget adapters!


